Meth Lab Awareness and Other Surprises

Responding to a fire, explosion, or medical emergency may not be what it seems. You could be the first one on the scene of a meth lab, and exposed to the dangerous environment, chemicals, and devices. Including booby traps that are used to control the local drug market, and protect their meth labs from intruders and unsuspecting responders. But did you protect yourself? Did you tell everyone else about the possibility of a lab? If you don't inform them are you liable? What you do could put your life and those around you at risk; knowing what NOT to do could be the secret to surviving! In this class we will look at meth labs and what they include. What chemicals are used and what to look for.

We will also look at some different types of devices that have been use to hurt and even kill drug counter parts in an effort to control the local drug market. We do this in an attempt to make you safer should you ever encounter one of these situations. While this is not a Haz-Mat course, all are welcome in an attempt to help communication between Firefighters, Law Enforcement Officers and Medical Providers.
